


The project aims to involve young people in the climate discussion, allowing their voices to be heard and contributing to the debate on the water and environmental crisis.


Connecting Cultures

The total number of letters collected from youth across Brazil and internationally is approximately 970, showcasing a powerful mobilization of voices for climate action.

Main Concerns of Brazilian Youth

Rivers Preservation

Young people expressed strong concern about the preservation of rivers, emphasizing the importance of these water sources for life, biodiversity, and their cultural and social value.

Pollution

Especially caused by waste and microplastics, was a recurring theme among participants, reflecting their worries about environmental health and its direct consequences for communities.

Impacts of droughts

The impacts of droughts and wildfires led to alarming accounts of water scarcity, affecting not only natural ecosystems but also agriculture and food security within communities.

Main Concerns of International Youth

Youth Engagement

Countries such as Indonesia and India demonstrate strong youth engagement, showing the potential of young voices to influence climate discussions and contribute to global solutions.

Diverse Themes

Participants address various themes, including floods, pollution, and community health, illustrating the urgent issues faced by youth worldwide in the context of climate change and environmental health.

Global Solidarity

The collaboration across nations emphasizes global solidarity, highlighting how youth from diverse backgrounds unite to advocate for environmental protection and climate responsibility on a worldwide stage.




