#### **1. Opening of the meeting and appointment of the Chair**

The President Eddy Moors is appointed as Chair of the meeting and opens the General Assembly. The President greets all the participants and welcomes the young participants, that is, the winners of the 5<sup>th</sup> Youth Contest "The Water We Want" who are present today for the award ceremony.

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## **2. Approval of the Record of last General Assembly**

The record of the previous General Assembly (Dec. 2024) is read and unanimously approved by the present members, with the abstention of those who were not present. The CEO, Eriberto Eulisse, invites participants to notify Monica Benettazzo ([mail@watermuseums.net](mailto:mail@watermuseums.net)) if they spot any discrepancy in the list of present / non-present members of the recordo.

## **3. Online Awarding Ceremony: 5<sup>th</sup> Youth Contest ‘The Water We Want’**

Lucrezia Gigante leads the online ceremony and announces the winners of the 5<sup>th</sup> Youth Contest ‘The Water We Want’, which this year include 117 entries from 25 different water museums. Lucrezia announces the 6 winners and 10 special mentions. Some winners are present in the meeting and express their happiness to have been selected and to have their works features on the website and promoted by WAMU-NET. The internal jury (composed of 5 members from various institutions) met previously to discuss and select the best artworks among many beautiful submissions. As usually, the best works will be exhibited in the online exhibition available on the WAMU-NET website.

## **4. 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of UNESCO-IHP: WAMU-NET awarded by UNESCO for its longstanding contribution to IHP**

The CEO reports on how WAMU-NET was awarded in June 2025 by UNESCO for its longstanding contribution to IHP during the celebrations held in Paris for the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of UNESCO-IHP. Eddy Moors expresses his reasons to be proud of this award, congratulating Eriberto and all the members of WAMU-NET for this well-deserved recognition. Thanks to the pioneering work implemented by WAMU-NET, today water museums are considered by UNESCO as key actors to promote water sustainability education. Eriberto also presents the side-event that WAMU-NET organized at UNESCO on this occasion, focusing on the MINA project of the Water Memorial for Brasilia, designed by the architect Oscar Niemeyer. Also the Special issue of the Blue Papers on Ancient Hydro-Technologies (AHTs), curated by Carola Hein and her team, UNESCO Chair at TU Delft, was presented with WAMU-NET’s contribution.

## **5. Status of 2025 Annual Membership Contributions (received until June 15<sup>th</sup>)**

The CEO recalls that no.38 membership contributions for 2025 (out of +120) are still to be paid by partners, so he invites all the members to be in line with the financial contributions from members foreseen by the the forecast budget for the needed operational activities of the Secretariat. The CEO stresses why annual Membership Contributions are so important for the core institutional activities of WAMU-NET’s Secretariat.

## **6. Approval of the Budget 2024**

The budget final result for 2024 is a loss of (-)12.000 €. This loss is mainly due to the exhibition organized at the 10<sup>th</sup> World Water Forum in Bali. Unfortunately, the fundraising campaign for this exhibition failed, so it became a relevant cost for WAMU-NET that had to implement it, as foreseen by the agreement with AICS (Italian Development and Cooperation Agency). However, the CEO stresses that the final loss in the 2024 budget would have been much worse (around -40.000 €), without the financial support of the Province of Trento. Eddy Moors stresses that it would be important to find other, more sustainable solutions for supporting the network financially in the long term. Finally, the CEO emphasises the crucial importance of funds from EU projects to support the operating costs of WAMU-NET’s staff over the next two years: these are the Soil Tribes and Aqua Motion projects (Horizon Programme).

## **7. Ongoing projects and 6<sup>th</sup> WAMU-NET International Conference (Brasilia, 4-8 November 2025)**

The CEO announces the opening of the new office of WAMU-NET in Ala, Trento – as part of the agreement made with the Province of Trento. This is a key achievement for WAMU-NET as it reduces

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the weight of operational costs related to the Executive Director. Eulisse briefly presents the European Horizon projects in which WAMU-NET is involved: the SoilTribes project (WAMU-NET is organizing a travelling exhibition comprising the work of 4 selected artists, which will travel to 7 museums in Europe); STARTS AQUAMOTION (involving 3 artistic residencies coordinated by WAMU-NET in 3 locations in Italy and possibly also at the Venice Biennale in 2026).

Eulisse introduces the next 6<sup>th</sup> WAMU-NET International Conference in Brasilia (4-8 November 2025), hosted by Adasa (Water Regulation Agency of Brasilia). Adasa proposed to host the conference, also considering their MINA project – the International Water Memorial, which will open in Brasilia in the next few years, in a building designed by Oscar Niemeyer. Débora Dinez (Adasa) confirms the logistical information and the draft programme that will be shared soon (prepared by WAMU-NET) with all members, also including the application form, a list of hotels, the deadline to register and other information about the conference. The conference will be organized in three days: the first day will be dedicated to discussing topics related to climate change and adaptation; the second day will be dedicated to the development of the Water Cloud (Education Repository) and to the winners of the water Film Prize “Back to Our Future”; the third day will host WAMU-NET’s General Assembly. Several social events including a city tour of Brasilia and a welcome and closing dinners will also be organized. A technical working group will be active to elaborate the content of the three-day conference. All partners are warmly invited to participate in this group.

#### **8. Water Film Prize ‘Back to Our Future’: presentation of the new video teaser produced by LTAW**

Eulisse provides an update about the Water Film Prize ‘Back to Our Future’ on ancient hydrotechnologies (AHTs). The CEO invites everyone to spread the Call and stimulate participants from all parts of the world, and to foster the importance of AHTs. The new video teaser produced by LTAW will be shared with members for further dissemination.

#### **9. Introduction of new WAMU-NET Members (1<sup>st</sup> semester 2025)**

Lucio Bonato announces the new six museum members of the network. They are located in India (2 museums), in China, in United Kingdom and in Italy (2 museums ) and the three individual members. The representatives of these museums introduce themselves to the other members of the network.

#### **10. AOB - Proposals and suggestions from the members**

Philippe Pypaert suggests to make an inventory of how many museums overlap with / belong to a UNESCO site/designation. Not for the sake of statistics, but to seek more synergies among UNESCO designations/sites and a network like WAMU-NET when it goes to Education for Sustainable Development / Water Education, a clear priority of UNESCO in these years.
