COP 30 is a crucial meeting for our planet, where people from many countries come together to discuss how to better care for Earth.






COP 30 will take place in the city of Belém, Brazil, in November 2025!











COP is an acronym for Conference of the Parties. The number 30 means it's the 30th time this meeting is happening. This meeting was created by the United Nations so that all countries participating in the Climate Change Convention can decide together how to protect Earth!

What topics will be discussed at COP 30?










These gases come from cars, factories, and burn-offs, making Earth hotter.

The idea is to reduce these gases and use clean energy, like solar and wind power!










We need to find solutions to these questions!

Prevent deforestation and take care of animals, rivers, lakes, and seas.








Protect people most affected by climate change, such as indigenous communities, fishermen, and residents of very hot regions or areas prone to flooding.


