


- Being part of a worldwide network of water museums and share experience with them

«UNESCO-IHP IN SUPPORT OF DEVELOPING FURTHER THE GLOBAL NETWORK OF WATER MUSEUMS»






New Resolution - Main contents

- 2) Possible direct support from Member States: through in-kind contributions or direct financial support to WAMU-NET
